DRAGON HEAD MASKS

Inspired by Dragons Love Tacos by Adam Rubin




STEP ONE

DRAW LINES ON CONSTRUCTION PAPER

This will add texture to the dragon mask. Explore how many lines you can create.

You can draw dragon scales. This is the backdrop for the dragon mask.

Let your imagination run free!



STEP TWO


TURN ONE SIDE INTO A CONE SHAPE


This will be the FRONT of the mask. Pick the design that you want on the front of the mask.

Fold the bottom of the paper into a cone shape overlapping each other.

STAPLE THEM TOGETHER

Make sure the staples face the outside of the mask to avoid the pointy parts of the staple being worn on the inside.







STEP THREE

CUT THE OTHER SIDE DOWN THE MIDDLE about an inch into the paper

Have both edges come together to make a W shape.





STAPLE THEM TOGETHER

Make sure the staples face the outside of the mask to avoid the pointy parts of the staple being worn on the inside.

IT SHOULD LOOK SOMETHING LIKE THIS \rightarrow






STEP FOUR

RIPPING UP PAPER

Rip up construction paper (the long side of the paper).

This will be used to decorate the mask, make some fire for the dragon, and anything else you want to add to your mask.





STEP FIVE

DECORATE YOUR MASK


Glue, staple, tape the construction paper to your mask however you want. Get creative!

STEP SIX


MAKE THE DRAGON FIRE

CUT the front part of the mask.

STAPLE/GLUE strips of paper to the front of the mask for the dragon fire.







STEP SEVEN

WEAR & PLAY WITH YOUR MASK

If you have fabrics or scarves, you can use them as dragon wings.

TIP for mask to stay in place

If you have string or elastic, you can use it to tie the mask to your face and hold it in place while you play.
